The wisemen saw a special star in the sky and followed it - it led them to Jesus. There are lots of things that can point us to Jesus. In this story, for the wisemen, it was a star. But for us, the bible can be something that points us to Jesus (remember, every story whispers His name), the beauty or complexity of creation might be something that points us to a creator, a God, maybe it's a beautiful sound or a pretty picture. Wise men (wise kids) seek him still.

#### Activities in your box
