Talk this through with your kids:

God coming to earth as a baby and living among us might be upside down from what we'd expect. Why didn't He come to earth with armies of angels? It's because God values relationship with us. He became human to help us understand, to give us a

way to choose Him. He didn't want to force us to know Him. Instead he made Himself relatable. Close. He moved into the neighbourhood so we could see His love through how he lives. A baby might be not be what we expected the rescuer to look like, but his life is a shout of hope into a weary world.
