BIBLE STUDY & DISCUSSION:

Recap last week: Can you remember last week's memory verse? Try and recite it together. How did you do with last week's challenge? Take some time to share with one another and encourage each other.

Let's recap what we've covered so far. We've talked about seeking God requiring action and one action we can take is reading our bibles. The bible points us to Jesus and by knowing Him we're saved.

This week's study:

Opening activity: How many different forms of communication can you think of? Here are some ideas to get you started: Talking, smoke signals, drawings...

Today we're going to talk about prayer.

Q: What is prayer? A: Prayer is communicating with God. It's 2 way! We can talk with Him, but we need to listen too.

Prayer is for anyone, anywhere, anytime. It's so important! A friendship is impossible without communication – the same can be said for our relationship with God. When we read about people talking with God in the Old Testament (before Jesus came) people would communicate to God through a priest or a prophet (like a giant game of telephone) often in a holy or special place. Now, because of Jesus, we can talk to God directly, anywhere.

But how do we pray? Jesus tells us how!

Read Matthew 6:7-13. Ask your kids to share their observations from the passage.

The passage we just read is often referred to as the Lord's Prayer. It teaches us how to pray. You can use the acrostic PRAY as an easy way to remember some of the things the Lord's Prayer teaches us.

PRAISE: The Lord's Prayer starts out with declaring who God is (v9). We can start our prayers by declaring truth and praise too. That might look like singing a song to God, saying truths about who God is or reading scripture, saying things we're thankful for. We can express praise in lots of different ways.

REPENT: The Lord's Prayer teaches us to ask God for forgiveness and say sorry for things that we've done wrong (v12). Repent means to be sorry and turn away from what was wrong.

 \mathbf{A} SK: We should pray for the things we need (v11). These might be physical needs, but emotional and spiritual needs. Not just for ourselves, but for others too.

VIELD: This means we give way to God, we acknowledge He is in control and we follow His lead (v10,13). We can do this by taking time to listen.

WEEKLY CHALLENGE:

Set a prayer goal for this week! Pray twice this week? Try and pray each day. Do something that will help you remember your goal. Your prayer time doesn't need to be super long – aim for a few minutes. Practice using **P**raise, **R**epent, **A**sk, **Y**ield as a framework for your prayers. You could speak your prayers out loud, write them out, or draw pictures, sing or talk in your head! Make sure you take some time to listen to God too.

ACTIVITY OPTIONS:

1. String Phone

Follow the YouTube tutorial to make a String Phone! You'll need 2 paper or plastic cups, string and tape.

LINK IT TO THE BIBLE POINT: We can talk to God through prayer! It's important we talk with God, but it's also important we take time to listen.

2. Work on the Memory verse

Come up with actions for each part of the memory verse

OR

try and fit the words to a song or tune you know

OR

write it out and post it by the sinks in your house and recite the verse while you wash your hands!

2. Pictionary/Creationary

You'll need pen and paper for this game. Try and communicate a word or phrase to the others playing by drawing (you can't talk or draw any letters or numbers)


If you have playdoh at home, you can play by trying to build the word/phrase instead
